



Teas will be available for purchase, cash and cards only.



A thirst for adventure and a 2008 marriage proposal brought Claire from the shires of middle England to the cornfields of middle -America where she quickly learned that ordering a cup of tea meant paying for a mug of microwaved water and a packet of dust to dip in it. At 12:30 pm on May 18, 1980, National Guard helicopter pilot Mike Cairns flew beneath the ash cloud and into the crater of the Mt. St. Helens volcanic eruption. In the days ahead, as Mike and his crew flew search & rescue missions, they documented the devastation with hundreds of photographs. Their missions would lead to three pilots and five crew members receiving the Valley Forge Cross. Mike was one of those three pilots to receive the National Guard's highest award for heroism. Join him as he presents his photographs in newly digitized format and shares his remarkable experience in the wake of one of the greatest volcanic explosions ever recorded in North America.





The <u>British Library</u> in London, England is the largest library in Europe and the second largest library in the world with a slightly smaller collection than the Library of Congress. Currently, the British Library has more than 150 million items in its catalogue and 3 million new items are added every year.

Not only is the British Library's collection large, the actual building is also quite impressive. The British Library is the largest public building constructed in the United Kingdom in the 20th century and has a total floor area of 12,000 square meters (129,166.93 square feet).

Did You Know?

The <u>basement of the British Library is over 24.5 meters (80.4</u> <u>feet) deep</u>, which is equivalent to an eight-story building.
