MUNCHERS WANTED

Are you interested in helping process the items donated to FOL? Our goal is to have 2 volunteers each day in the library to help with this process, since with 2 volunteers each day there is always a backup person if you cannot come in. The process includes:

- -emptying the donation deposit (THE MUNCHER)
- sorting the items by genre
- -restocking the meeting room shelves and boxing the excess items.

Time required depends on how many items there are to process (can be as little as 15 minutes and on occasion 1 hour). All volunteers receive FOL Book Bucks for their time and first selection of all donated items. Currently we are in search of a second person for Friday and Saturday & 2 volunteers for Sunday. Volunteers can come in to process items anytime the Library Staff is in attendance. 

July 2022 Theme: Narwhal and Jelly Book Craft Kit: Beaded Jellyfish






August 2022 Theme: Avatar the Last Airbender Universe Craft Kit: Pufferfish Magnet

2022 Patron Survey

The Board of Trustees (BOT) extends an appreciative thank you to each FOL member and to all the patrons that participated in our 2022 survey. We had over 500 respondents who gave their time to answer what library services they used and what programs and services they would like to see.

We conducted our first patron survey in 2019. The BOT used that input in creating the Ocean Shores Library 2020-2025 Strategic Plan. Since we are halfway through the plan, the board felt it was time to again check-in with the public. The BOT is now comparing the 2019 responses to those in 2022 to examine what needs stayed the same and what changed in our growing community.

Book Notes

"Little Souls" by Sandra Dallas, is an historical romance and mystery novel set against the background of the 1918 pandemic and World War I. Dallas tells a page-turning, yet tear-jerking tale of sisterhood, love and how tough times make tough decisions. It's a short, sweet book that is even pertinent for us today.

An amazing debut novel, "The Sweetness of Water" is by 29 year old author, Nathan Harris. It takes place at the end of the Civil War when all the slaves were released and the American South was in quite a bit of chaos. Two recently freed brothers find a place to live with a Southern couple who lost their son in the conflict, while a pair of Confederate soldiers carry on a secret affair. A beautifully written but very readable book with many deep thoughts.

Anthony Horowitz has constructed a clever mystery within a murder mystery in the novel "Magpie Murders". Protagonist, Susan Ryeland, has received top-selling mystery author Alan Conway's latest manuscript. Susan finds that it contains a fascinating but irritating element which leaves her as the only person who can solve its mystery. A whodunit set in England with a British style and sense of humor.


